First Business Meeting

I. Call to Order

Speaker of the House Shellie Pike called the 39th Annual Meeting of the ASRT House of Delegates to order at 8:04 a.m., Friday, June 28, 2024.

The American Society of Radiologic Technologists opposes the operation of fluoroscopy equipment by any advanced practice nonphysician practitioners (APNP) without the collaboration

and/or direct supervision of a licensed physician, completion of training equivalent to the American Academy of Physician Associates (AAPA) and ASRT Fluoroscopy Educational Framework for the Physician Assistant and passing the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) fluoroscopy examination. Collaboration means the continuous availability of in-person communication between the APNP and physician.

Action: There being more than two-thirds in the affirmative, late motion number one will be introduced.
